

TORN FROM THE FLAG

A Documentary Film Project

Ladies and Gentlemen:

Allow me to draw your attention to a new documentary film entitled “Torn from the Flag,”¹ which is about the Hungarian Revolution of 1956 and its significant international consequences. This revolt served as an important harbinger of the future downfall of communism and later political and economic rearrangement of the world.

This feature-length film is being produced to honor the 50th anniversary of the Hungarian uprising and will be part of the worldwide celebration in 2006. The filmmakers’ objective is to screen “Torn from the Flag” at movie theaters and film festivals as well as on television stations around the globe. The unique aspect of the project lies in the fact that it will examine the revolution from outsiders’ points of view. In the autumn of 1956, a group of Bulgarian, Greek, and Korean students and locally-stationed Russian soldiers joined in the Hungarian uprising and became willing to sacrifice their own lives despite the fact that the fight was not their own. It is therefore our intent to interview those citizens from other countries who participated or were substantially affected by this event. We, the filmmakers, feel that this unusual approach will lend more credibility to our chronicle and prove instrumental in elevating the Hungarian revolution to its rightful place of honor in world history.

Raising the capital as quickly as possible is of the utmost urgency. The advanced age of many of these courageous freedom fighters calls for immediate attention. “Torn from the Flag” enjoys the strong backing of the Hungarian community, and we are also in the process of securing significant patronage from the international community. Many influential individuals and institutions have already pledged their support. Oscar-winning cinematographer Vilmos Zsigmond has furnished us with a letter of intent expressing his interest in working on this project as well. The Hungarian National Film Archive has also kindly lent us its commitment in writing. Other supporters include the Hungarian Cultural Center of New York, the American Hungarian Foundation, the Szechenyi Hungarian National Library and the William Fox Hungarian Film Club. Furthermore, the Hungarian Consul Generals of New York and Los Angeles, Dr. Gabor Horvath and Szabolcs Kerek-Barczy, and the Honorary Consuls of Hungary, Ilona Szablya and Dr. Laszlo Bojtos have endorsed this film.
